Since his tenth birthday Ned has always argued with his mother and no longer lives at home. "I lie, steal, and cheat. I've got a drug problem", he says. "I hate everything." His dad died when he was nine. His mother says, "He is going to end up in prison, and it'll be my fault."

Emily, aged 15

Emily was a happy girl who did well at school. Now she stays away from school all the time. Her behaviour changed at 13, when her mother remarried her father after being divorced for three years. She drinks a lot, stays out all night, and provokes her mother. "It's my life and I can do what I want," she says.

Jamie, aged 17

Jamie is a very intelligent boy, but five schools asked him to leave in just three years. His parents are divorced. "I fight a lot," he says. "I am going to end up in prison or get seriously hurt if I don't go to this camp. I hope it helps." (245 words)
